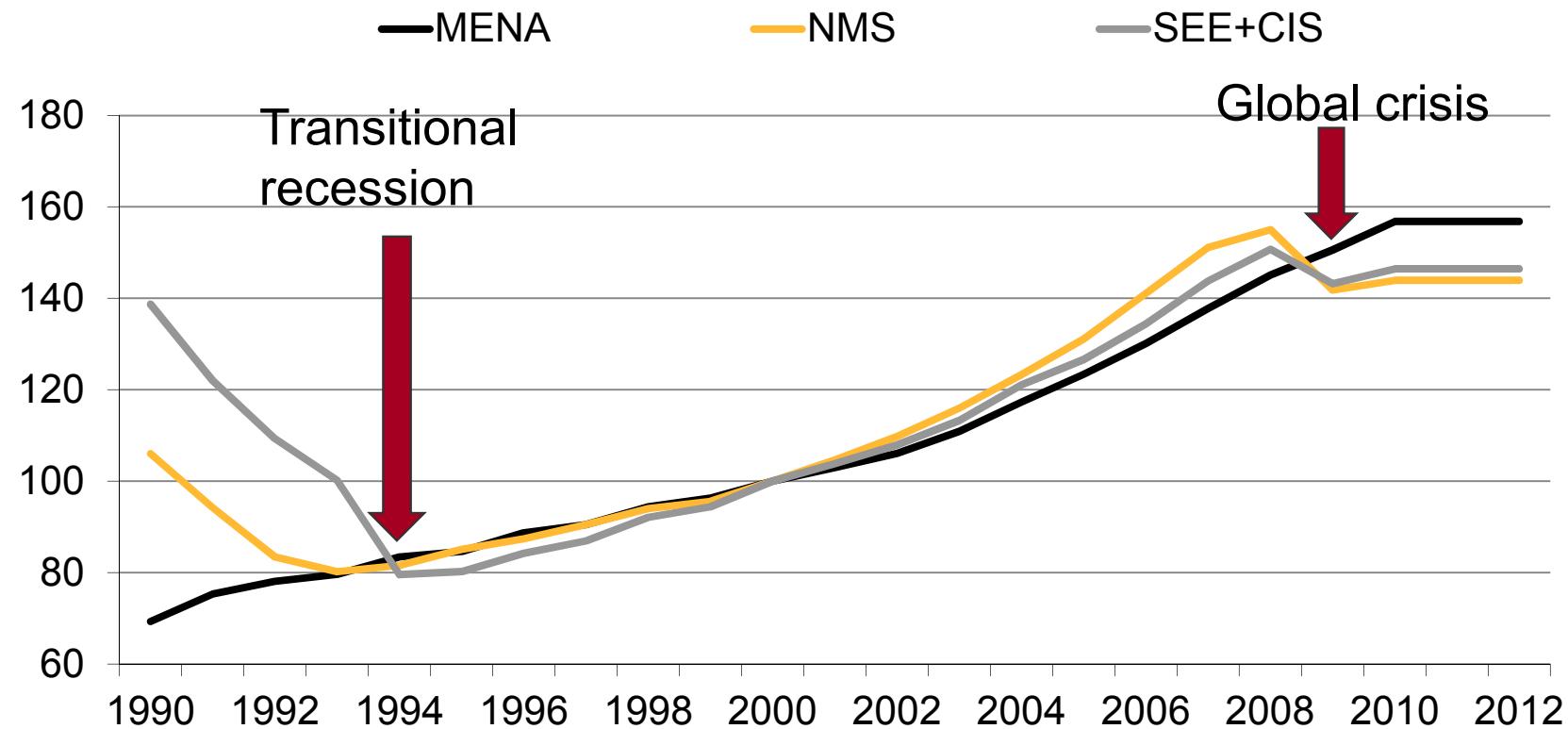

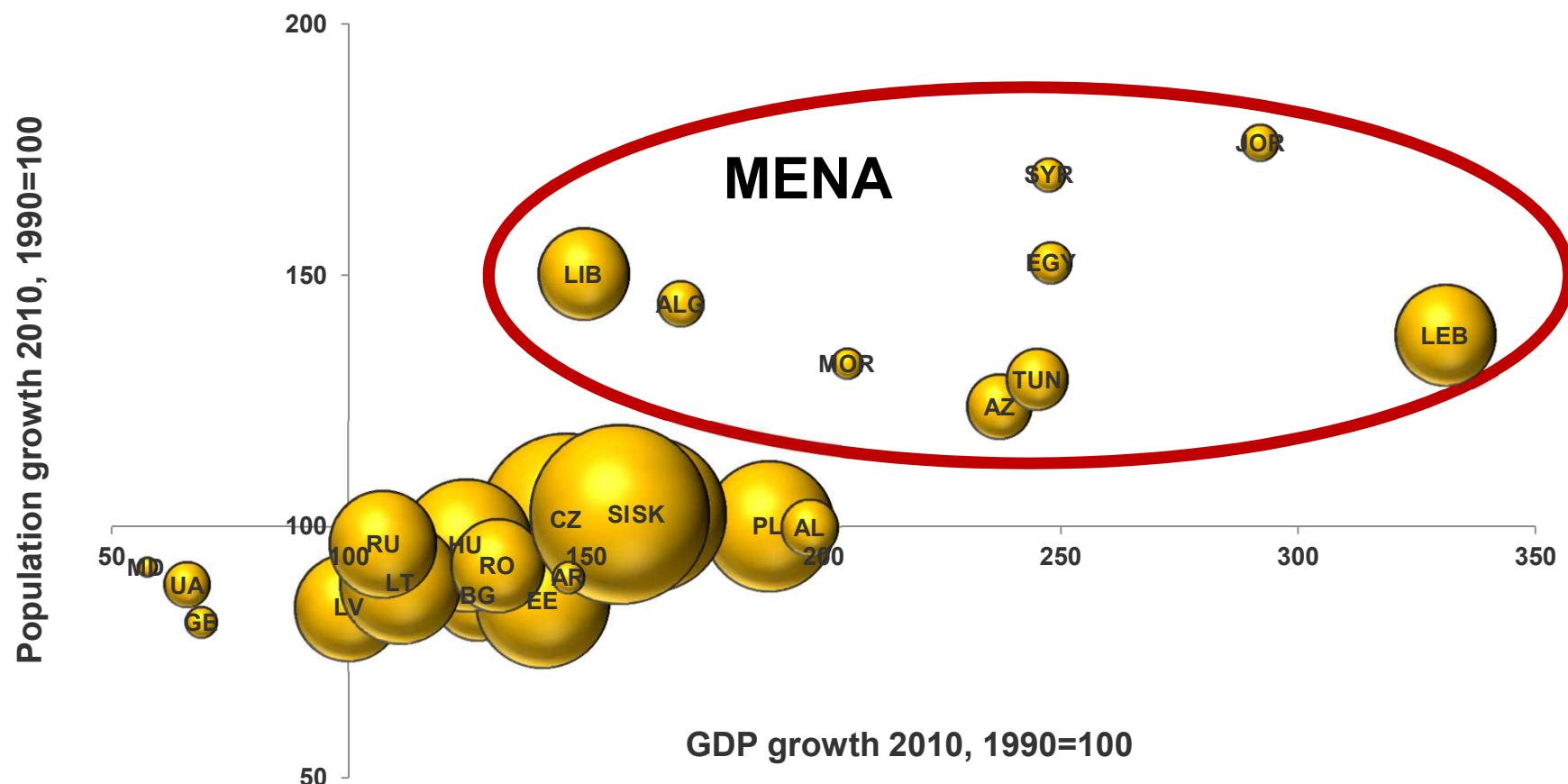

2000=100, unweighted averages

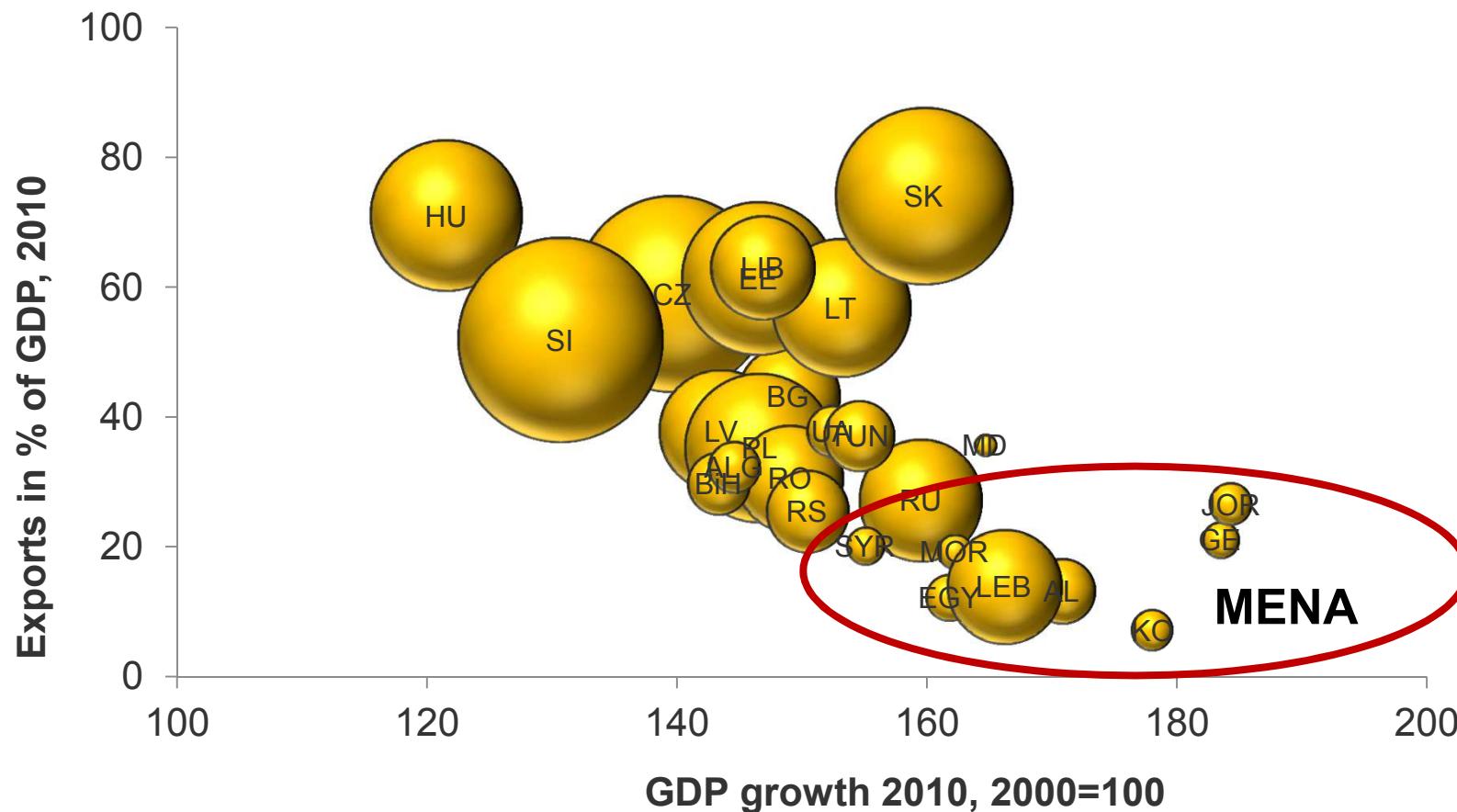


## GDP, population growth (1990-2010) and development levels (bubbles correspond to GDP per capita at PPP, EUR, year 2010)

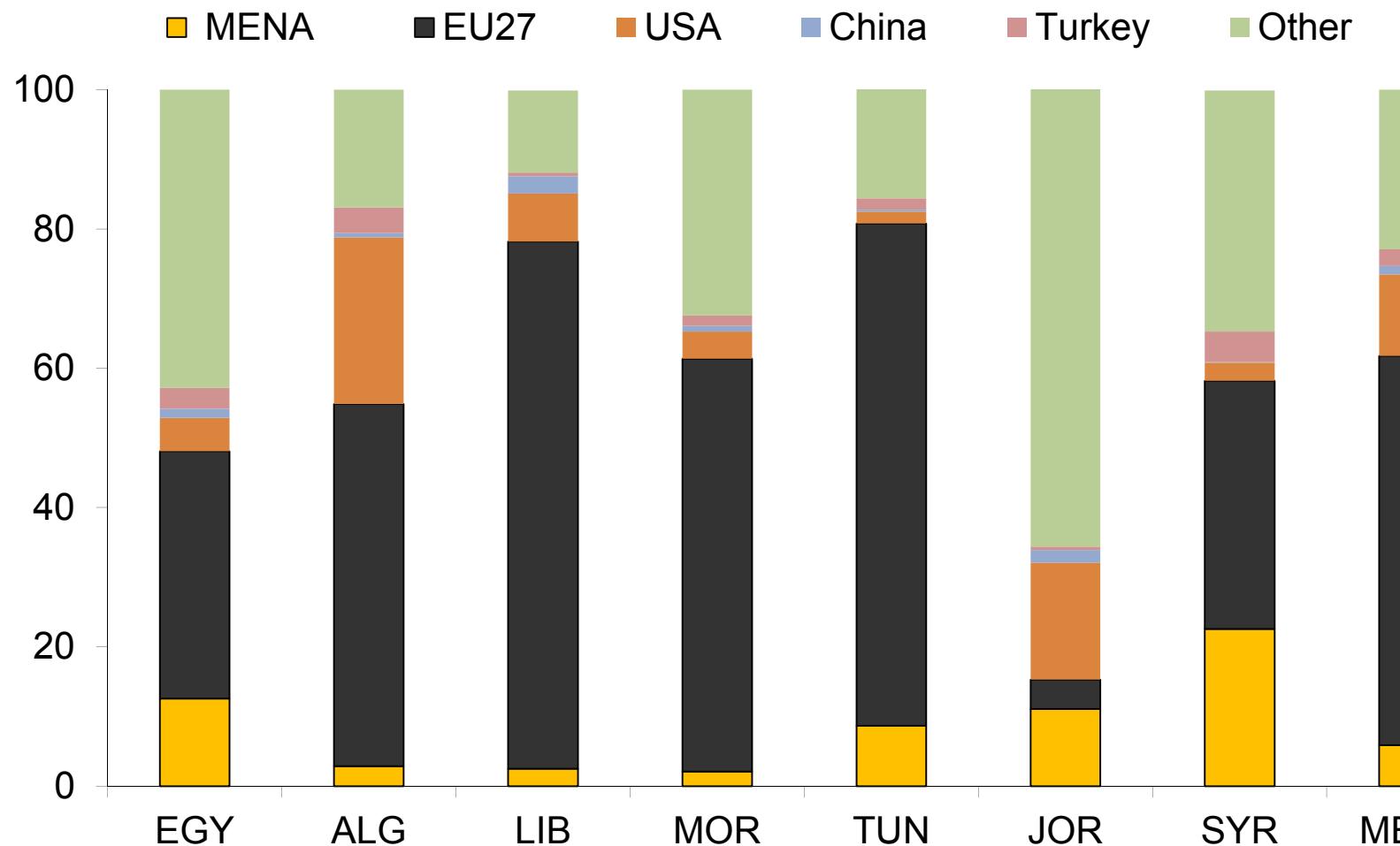

## GDP growth, exports in GDP and development level (bubbles correspond to GDP per capita at PPP, EUR, year 2010)

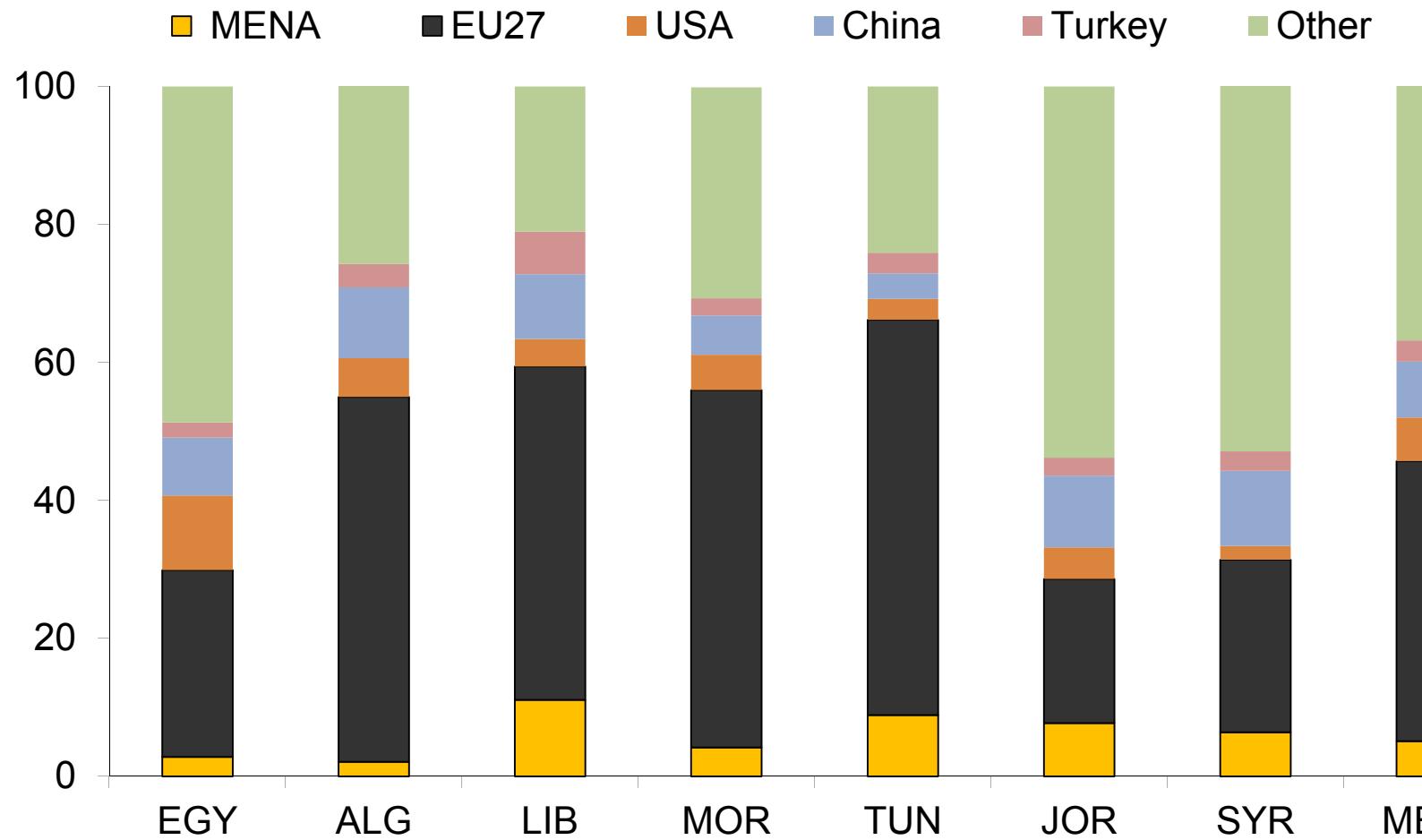


## MENA exports by region, shares in total exports (%), 2008



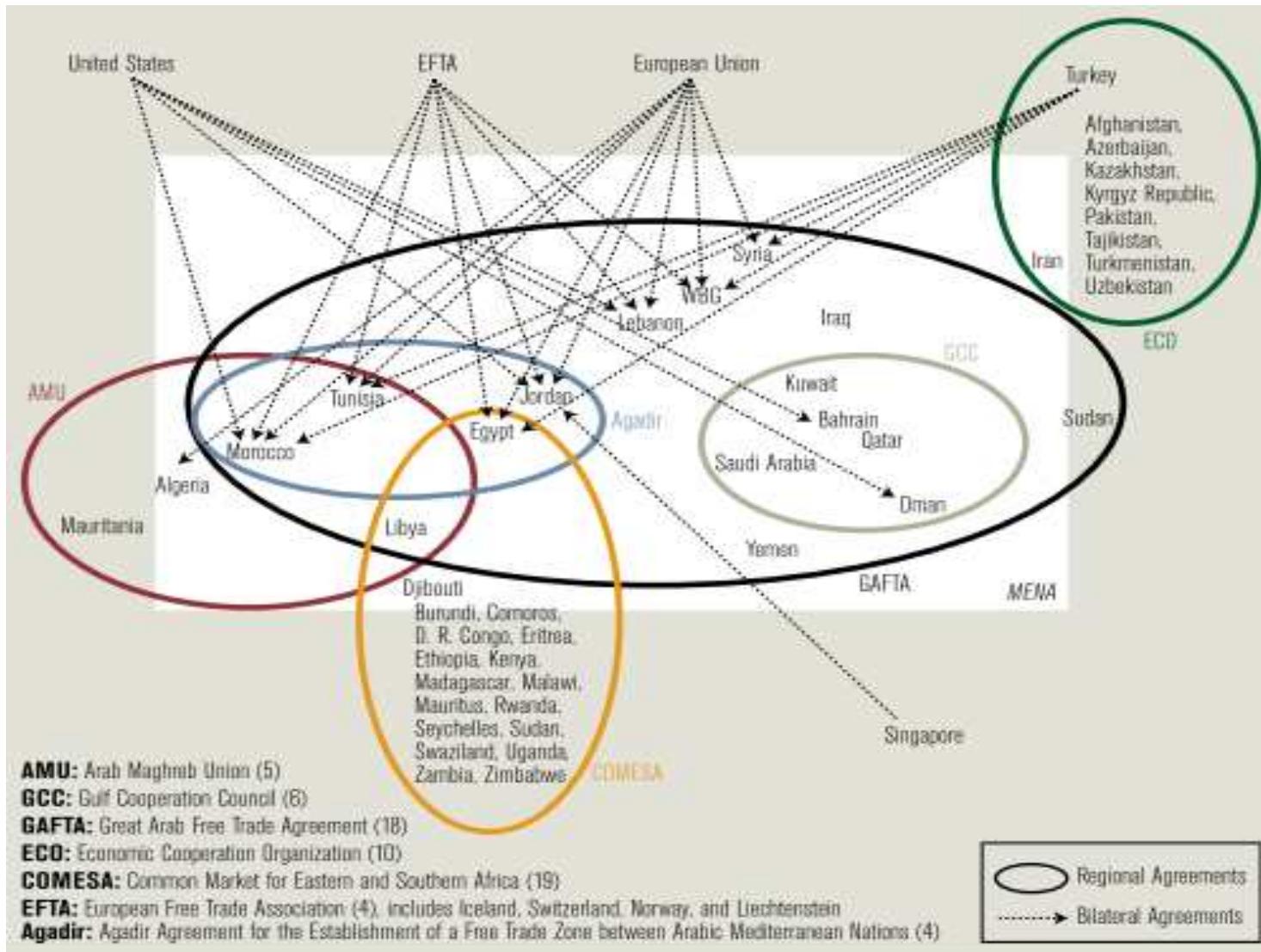

## MENA imports by region, shares in total imports (%), 2008

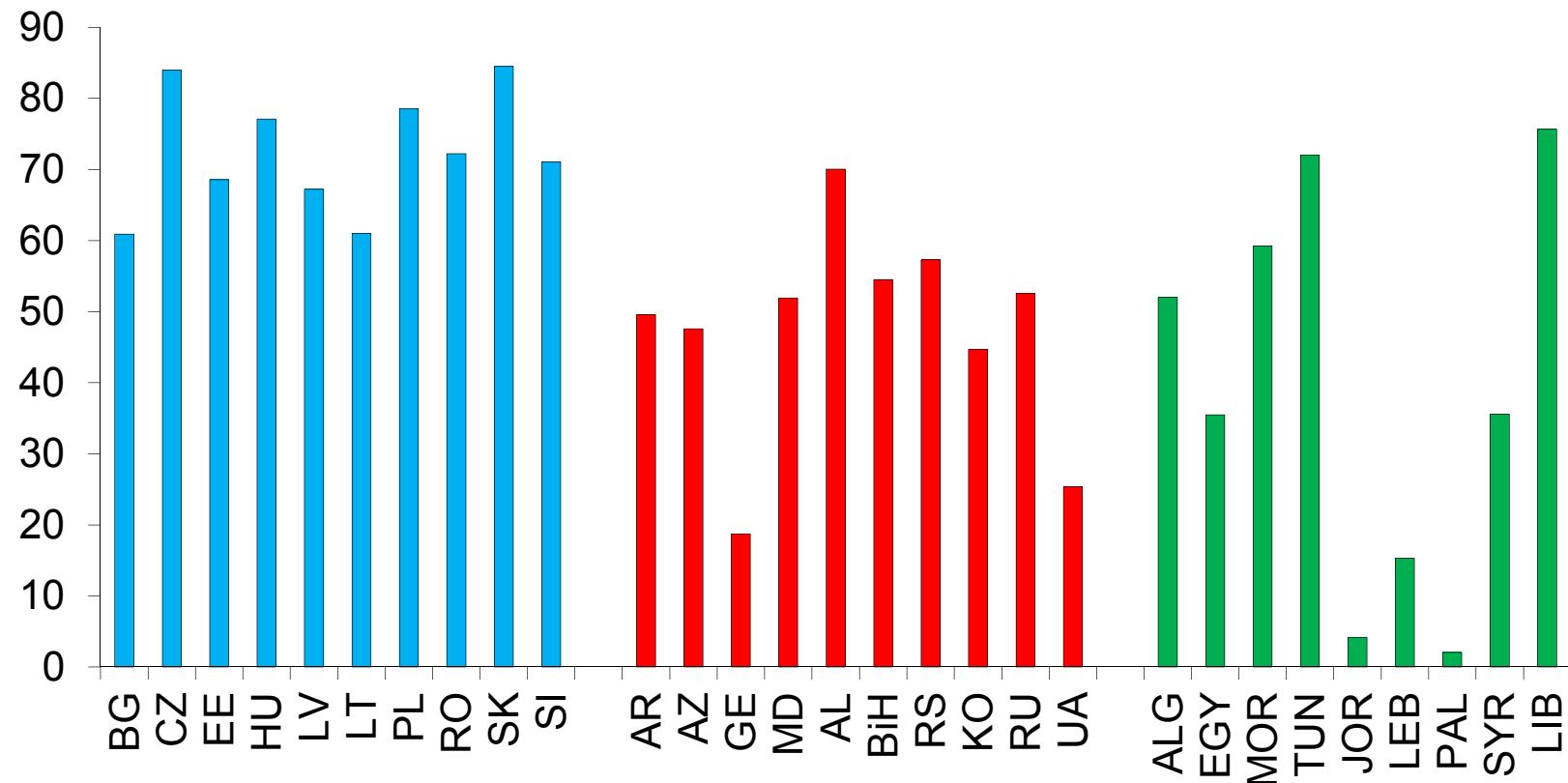

## Maps of regional integration in MENA

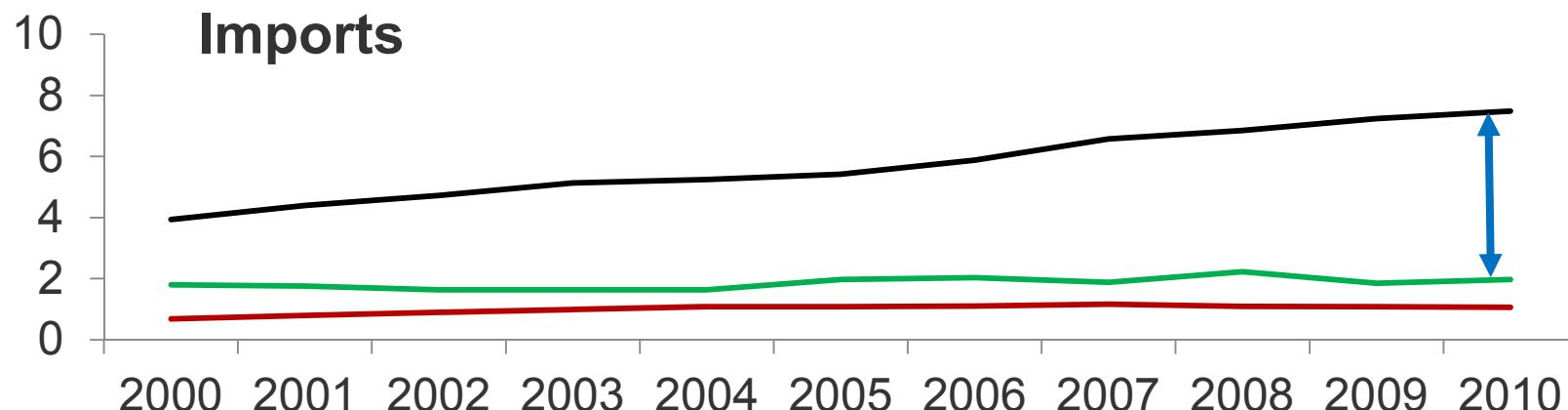
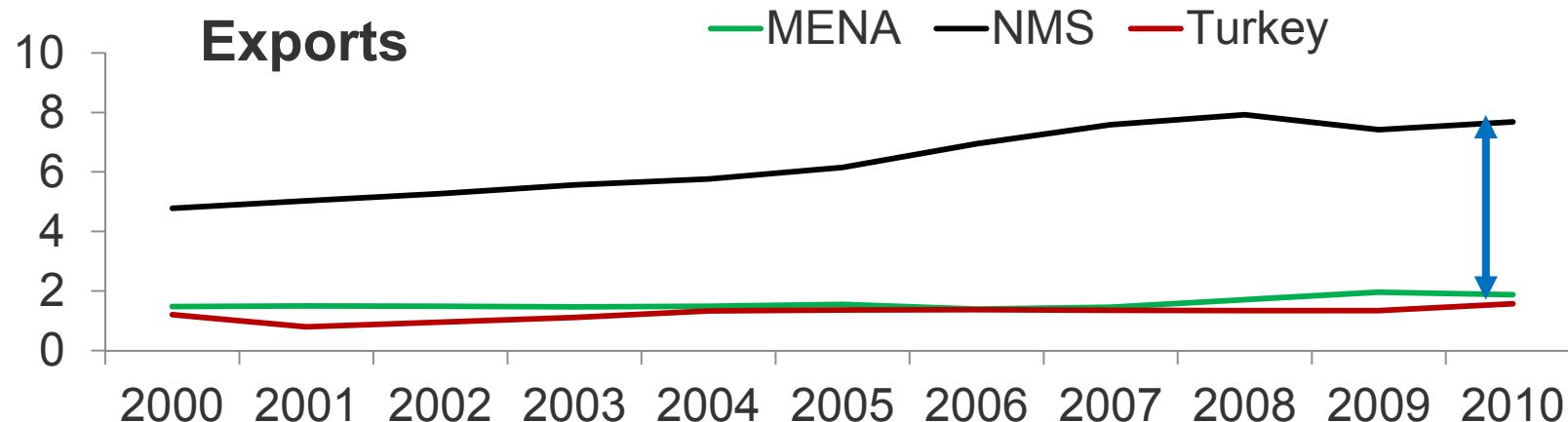


## Exports to the EU in % of total exports, MENA and CESEEs

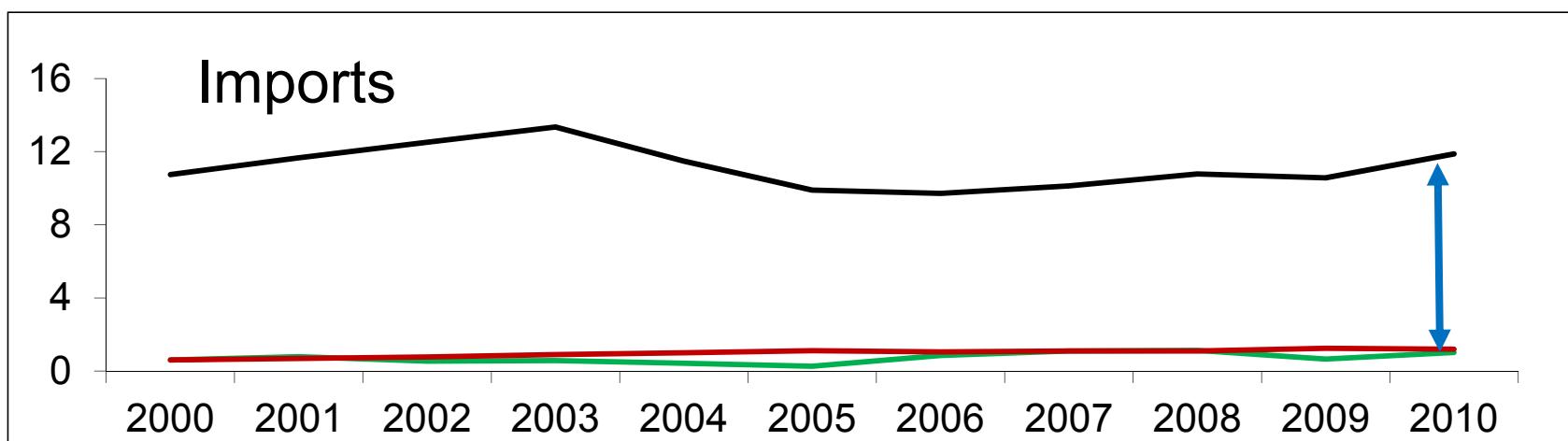
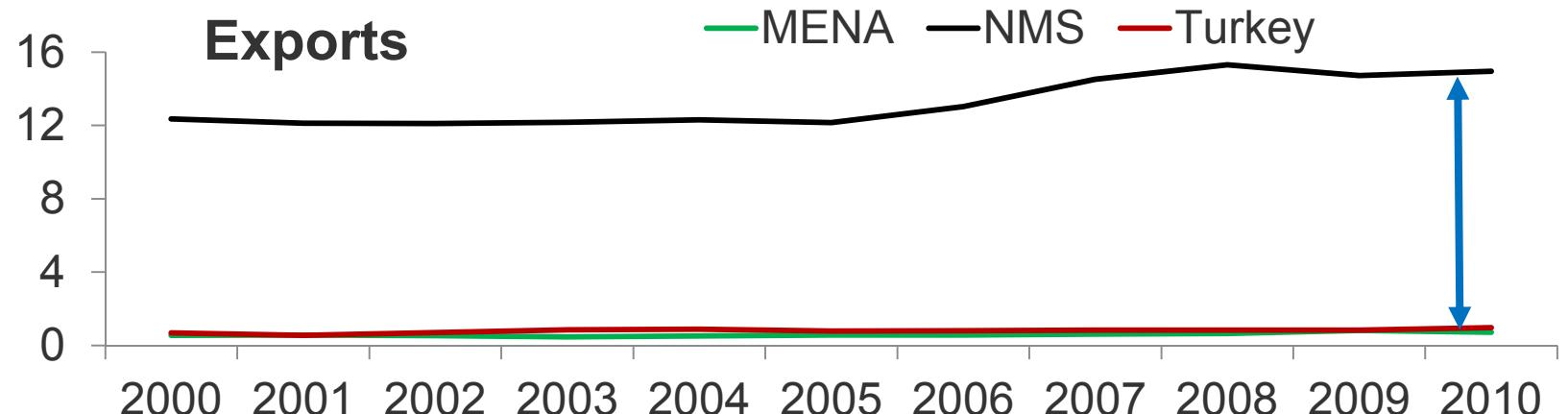

## EU foreign trade with MENA, NMS and Turkey (shares in total EU trade in %)

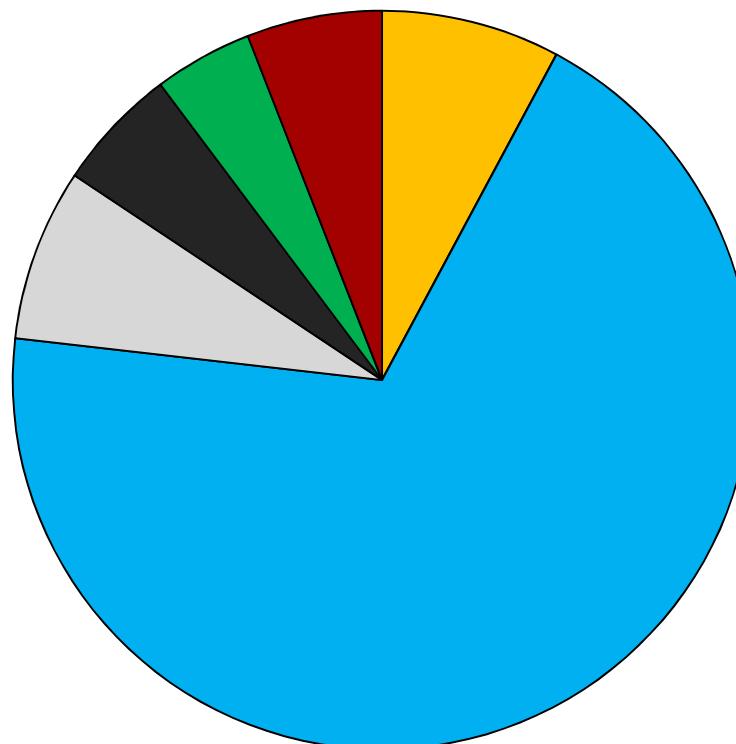


## Austrian foreign trade with MENA, NMS and Turkey (shares in total Austrian trade in %)

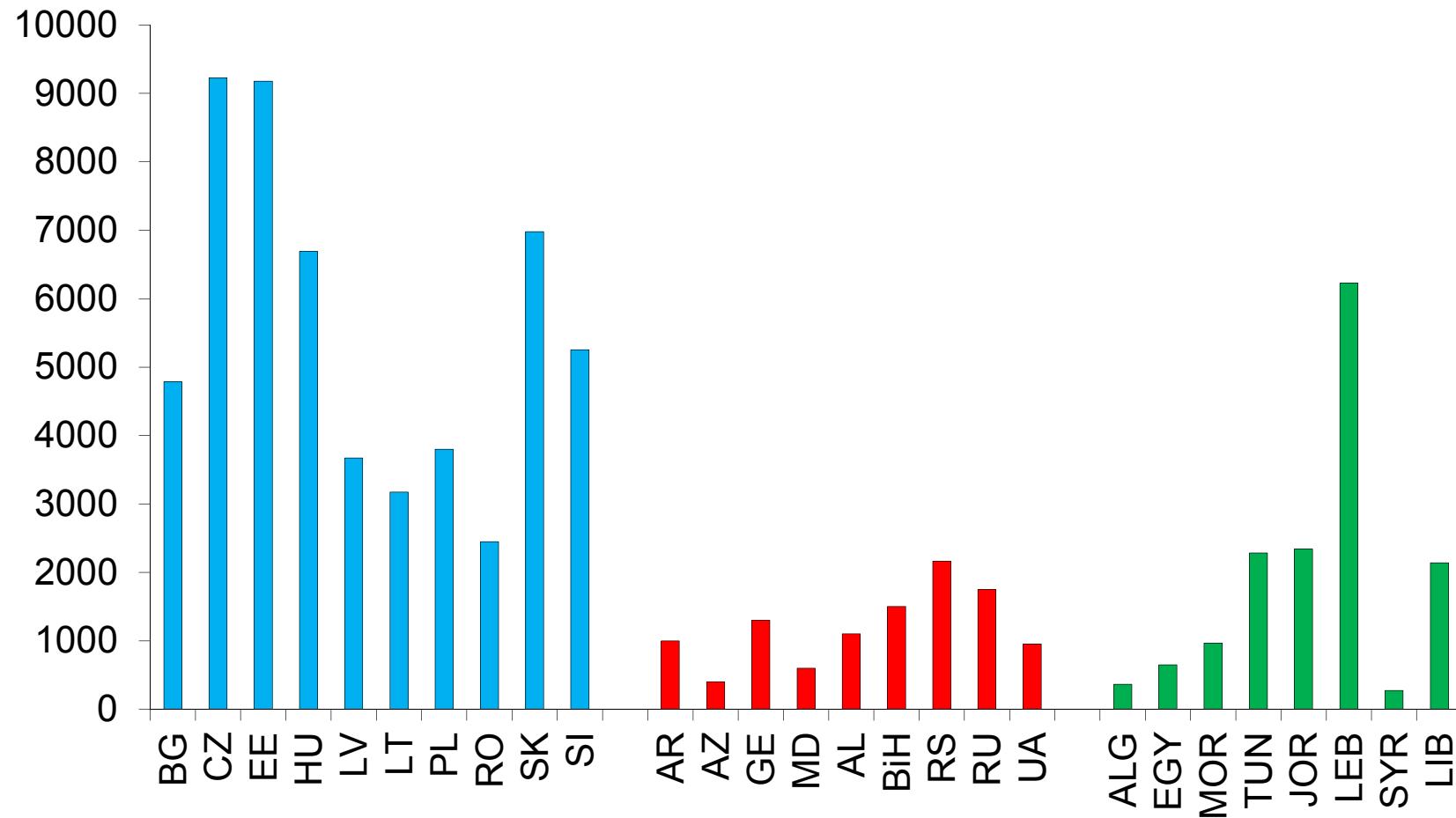


## MENA: Exports by SITC commodity groups (shares in total MENA exports in %, 2008)

■ Manufactures    ■ Machinery            ■ Consumer goods

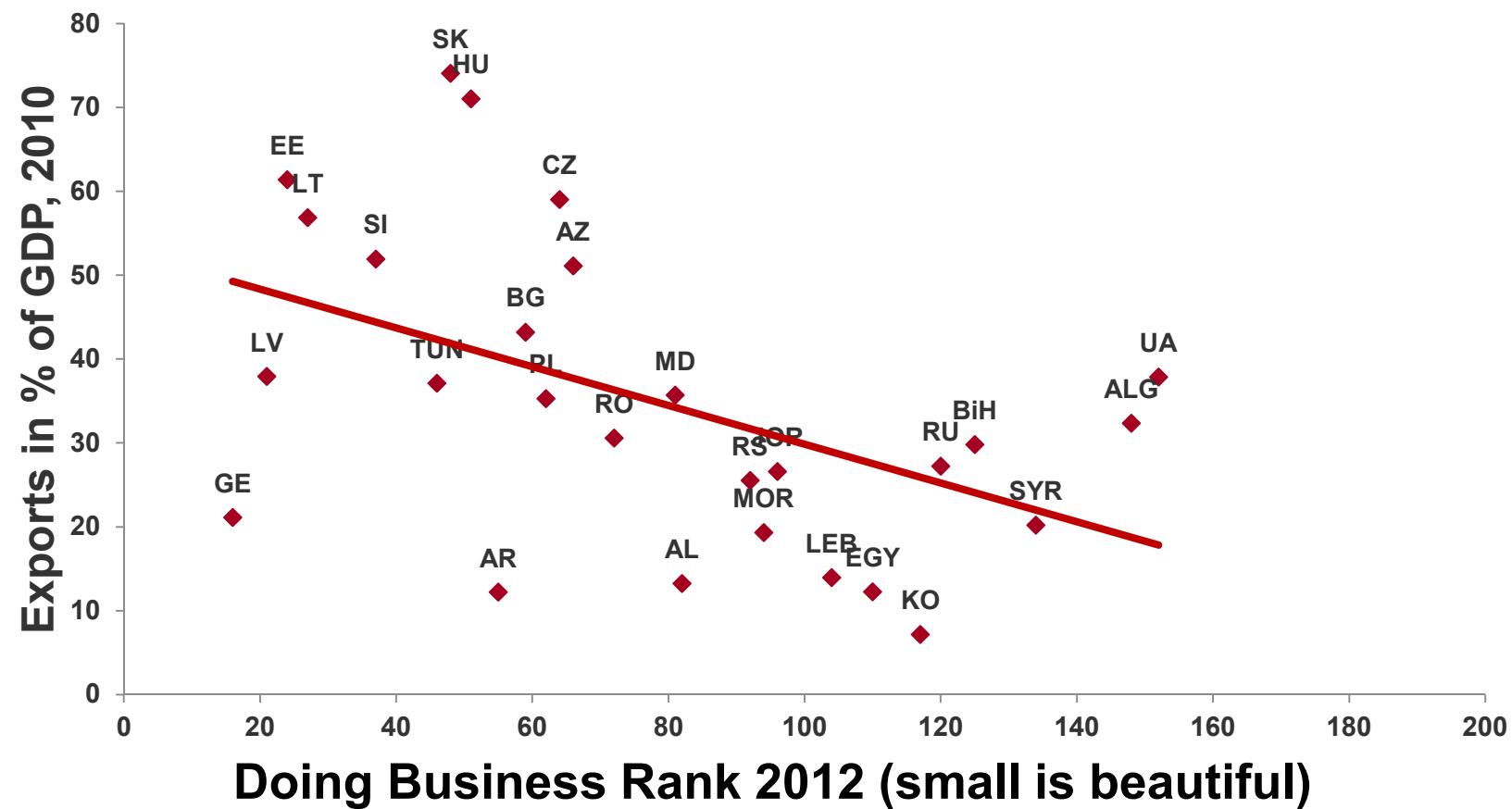


## FDI inward stock, EUR per capita, year 2010

# Exports and Ease of Doing Business



## Challenges, lessons and prospects for MENA (I):

- disappointing growth: lagging behind and desillusion may spark unrest and transitions
- transformational recessions next ?
- trade restructuring, diversification (via FDI) urgently needed
- will require improvements in business climate
- intra-MENA trade integration and cooperation helpful !
- Pan-Islamic integration as a reform anchor ?

## Challenges, lessons and prospects for MENA (II):

- asymmetry in EU-MENA trade relations
- EU has little direct economic interests in MENA - except for energy and migration (fears)
- despite 16 years of Policy Dialogue, AA/FTA (ex Libya)
- EU can help mostly with advice (e.g. lessons from CESEE transitions), but watch demography !
- No EU accession anchor !
- be prepared for long transitions and even setbacks !
